RULES & GUIDELINES

- 1. **Poetry Recitation Competition:** A choice of poems has been provided for each age group at Primary school level. Secondary level poems are up to the individual competitor. However, all participants are welcome to recite a poem of their choice providing the **poem is in Irish**. This is to encourage students to learn Irish and to develop their interest in the language through poetry. Secondary school children that attended Gaelscoileanna will be entered in a separate category to those students that did not. **Please specify on your entry form if you did attend a Gaelscoil or not.**
- 2. Art Competition: The themes and the various divisions of this competition are as follows:

ART COMPETITION

Rang / Primary school Yr 1- 2 Theme: An tEarrach (Spring)

Rang / Primary school Yr 3- 4 Theme: Céiliúradh Lá na Féile Pádraig (St Patrick's Day Celebrations)

Rang / Primary school Yr 5-7 Theme: An Chumann Lúthchleas Gael (The GAA)

Bliain / Year 8 - 10 Theme: Cultúr na hÉireann (Irish Culture)

Bliain / Year 11 - 12 Theme: An Ghaeltacht (The Gaeltacht)

Bliain / Year 13 -14 Theme: Éireannaigh Móra le Rá (Famous Irish People)

Please ensure that if there is any writing on the pictures that the writing is in Irish as we are trying to encourage the use of Irish throughout the competitions of this Fleadh and that entries are on paper no bigger than A3. Also, please write the following information clearly on the back of each picture.

3. Traditional Music Competitions

Age categories are as follows for these competitions:

Under 10/ Faoi 10,

Under 12/ Faoi 12,

12 - 15,

15 - 18,

Over 18.

All competitors under the age of 10 before and including the 1^{st} of January 2019 are eligible to play in the Under 10 competitions. Competitors that are 10 on or before the 1^{st} January 2019 may not enter the Under 10 category. They must enter the Under 12 category. Those who are 12 on or before 1^{st} January 2019 must enter 1^{st} – 15 category. Those competitors that have turned 15 on or before 1^{st} January 2019 must enter the 1^{st} – 18 category, and those who turned 18 on or before 1^{st} January 2019 must enter the Senior Over 18 category.

There will be competitions for the following instruments: fiddle, tin whistle, flute, banjo/mandolin, concertina, accordion, harp, bodhrán, traditional singing Irish, traditional singing English, Duets and Trios.

Traditional singing:

Entrants may sing <u>one</u> song of their own choice and can use live accompaniment if they wish. They can either play themselves or get <u>one</u> musician to accompany them.

Solo Instrumental:

All tunes must be played twice in each age category. Entrants in the Under 10 (U10) category will only be expected to play one tune of their choice. Entrants in the U12, 12 - 15 and 15 – 18 categories will be expected to play two tunes, both tunes must be different in type e.g. 1 reel and 1 jig or 1 hornpipe and 1 waltz. Please note bodhrán players must provide their own live musician to accompany. He/ she does not have to fall into the same age category as the bodhrán player. For example, a Bodhrán player entering 12-15 competition could have his/her 19 year old sister/ friend playing for him/her. Over 18 competitors will be expected to play a third dance tune in a different style. For example, Reel, Jig, Hornpipe.

Duets/Trios

These are new competitions and will be judged the same as the solo instrumental competition so the same rules regarding performance and age categories apply here aswell. However, Duets must be two melody instruments, but the Trio competition can be two melody instruments and an accompaniment instrument or three melody instruments. Singers are not permitted in this category.

Slow Airs

Slow airs may **ONLY** be played in the slow air competition. <u>PLEASE NOTE: Competitors entering the slow air competitions must play a slow air and not a slow tune. For example Sí Beag, Sí Mór is A <u>SLOW TUNE not a slow air.</u> Each tune should be played twice through and rules regarding the number of tunes per age group is the same as Solo Instrumental category above. For example: U10 – one slow air, U12 2 slow airs, O18s 3 slow airs etc. <u>Please inform a member of staff at the help desk in the assembly hall if you or your child are entering the slow air competition. As it is new we haven't put it on the timetable yet.</u></u>

4. Comhrá/Conversation

This competition provides an excellent opportunity for parents of children of all ages to experience how Irish-medium Education can deliver true bilingualism.

What is the Conversation Competition? In the competition the adjudicator talks informally to each child in Irish on a variety of everyday topics; their likes and dislikes, their family, school life and their friends. This competition gives parents an insight into the amount of Irish their child has and how much they understand. In some cases the younger children may answer the adjudicator in English, but this shows that the child has understood what was asked in the first place. In this competition children will be assessed on their confidence and communication skills and not on how much Irish they have or their standard of Irish. For secondary school children there will be Gaeltacht Scholarships awarded at the adjudicator's discression. To be in with a chance to win a scholarship the competitor must enter this competition and at least one other to show their abilities in Irish cultural activities.

5. Entry Forms and Fee.

Entry form for teachers - Please use one entry form per competition.

Fill in the name and number of each competition at the top of the form. List each of the children / young people taking part the competition. Please insert at the bottom of the entry form the fee paid.

Entry form per pupil.

Only one form per pupil to be used.

Fill in the entrant's name at the top of the page. Fill in all the information (Name of school, Teacher's name, Class). List the name and number of each competition the child/ young person wishes to enter. Please fill in the fee enclosed at the bottom of page.

Competition fee: £3 per pupil per competition

*Entries for the poetry, art, singing and traditional music competitions will not be accepted later than Friday 8th March 2019

This is to allow for a programme and time schedule to be drawn up for the day of the Fleadh and to have a chance to look at the art entries before the Fleadh date. Schools will be notified of the times of each of the competitions in advance.

5. Football, Hurling and Camogie Blitzes.

Rules for the blitzes are as follows:

The blitzes are organised through the Clubs not the schools.

All clubs are asked to bring a panel of 10 players. All players must be U-12 in 2019.

Games are 7-a-side. Clubs can make subs freely throughout the day.

Game length = 13 mins straight through. **The final will be two halves of 10 mins with a 1 min break.** Hooter will sound at the end of the half and beginning of new half.

Hooter will sound at the beginning and end of each game.

2 minute break between games. Hooter will sound at the end of the 2 mins to start the next game and the ball will be thrown in. All teams should be on the pitch ready to play before the hooter sounds.

Each team plays each other team in the group once in group games, with top 2 teams playing final at the end.

The Referees decision is FINAL.

Please remember to enjoy your day and to be respectful by staying off the pitches and by bringing any litter you have with you out of the 3G pitch.
